### Turning Over Any New Leaves?

January 2013

Common practice this time of the year is to make commitments to new behaviors; exercise regiments, diets, homework, etc... More common is the practice of breaking these commitments within several weeks.

Now take a minute and think about how things would be today if you had kept your new year's resolution from last year? ...from the year before? ...from ten years ago? Your figure, your health, your grades -- do you like what you see?

Now translate that vision to the thought of your soul. It is daunting to think about the state of your soul -- it is difficult to discern or perhaps even begin to understand what it is in practical terms. Your soul is the authentic you -- your essence that will always exist and will experience the fullest of love, bliss, and eternal happiness when it is together with God. Leading to this eternal happiness is the life that you now live...

Much in the same way that following through on our commitments is what produces the results we desire at New Year's -- if we remain vigilant in our commitment to Jesus Christ, our soul moves closer to the experience that it desires...the Kingdom of Heaven.

We initiate this pilgrimage through a 3-Stage Process:

- 1) Choice -- you must choose to make the health of your soul your #1 priority.
- 2) Commitment -- make commitments that are rooted in every capacity of your life that align you with Christ. These commitments should reflect and invest your life's time, talents and treasures.
- 3) Follow through on your commitments!

Your participation in this 3-Stage Process is not the "turning over of a new leaf," but rather it is your Christian journey and it leads to eternal life. The continuation and progression of this journey requires daily reestablishment, reengagement and refreshing! This process is arduous; however, in Christ we experience an infinite source of refreshment that allows us to maintain fortitude throughout our lives.

What are the commitments that you will make today on your pilgrimage of faith? Will you choose to make these commitments, and will you choose to follow through on them?

Your spiritual home at Nativity of Christ is the haven where your choices are guided, your commitments are supported and Christ's refreshment is delivered. Commit or recommit to

your life in Christ, shepherded and renewed through your commitment as an active parishioner at Nativity.

May our Lord bless us all as we grow in Christian pilgrimage through the growth of our chosen Christ-centered commitments.

The treatments will be one treatment, two days in a row, every four weeks, for a cycle of six treatments. We ask for your continuing prayers for healing. We pray that our loving and gracious God will bless you and your families as we celebrate the Nativity of our Lord, and grant you all a peaceful and healthy New Year.

and i heard Him proclaim as He walked out of sight, "in the midst of this darkness, I AM STILL THE LIGHT."

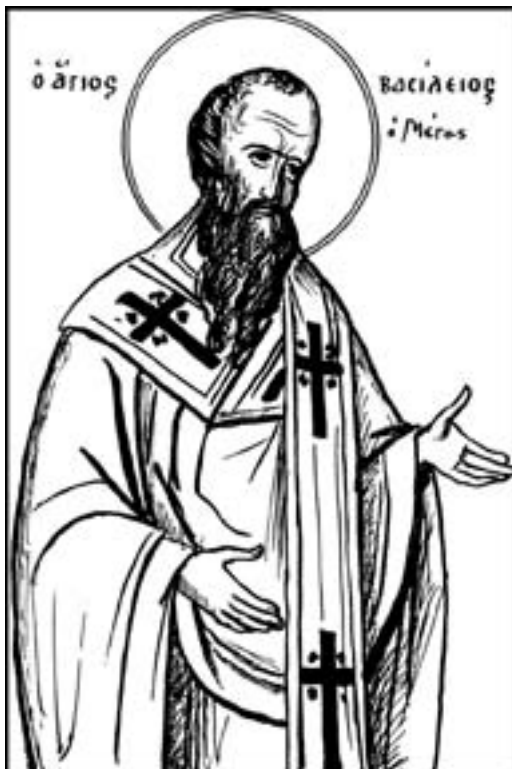
