Come Receive the Light!

May 2013

"Come receive the light from the unwaning light, and glorify Christ, Who has risen from the dead."

~ from the Holy Resurrection Service

In a few short days, we will have journeyed from various points of human experience to the invitation to eternal life! The life of God is eternally good, and in the words initiating the Holy Resurrection Service, we are called to receive Him by joining ourselves to Him. Regardless of where we have come from, or the journeyed path that we have taken, at that moment, 12:00 am Pascha Sunday, we are all called to the love of God through the invitation of His Church to *come receive the light!*

Why?

Light is not only the opposite of darkness -- it is the remedy! When light is present, darkness cannot exist.

Unfortunately, we see darkness all around us: threats of nuclear attack, economic uncertainty, acts of terrorism, teen suicides – all of this in just the last week, and all symptomatic of a developed/developing moral vacuum. Often we see the manifestations of darkness, and search for explanation by identifying sources of darkness, i.e., *who is the bad guy?*

Identifying "the bad guy" of a situation potentially allows us to temporarily address problems, but it does nothing to the greater experience of darkness. Adolf Hitler was identified and is dead, but we still experience dictators obsessed with oppressive ambitions of world domination! In order to address the greater experience of darkness, we must understand its nature. In the

most simplistic terms, darkness is the absence of light. Darkness only exists if light does not.

If we focus on light, and continually seek its experience, then darkness cannot exist.

We must rejoice! Light exists, and it cannot be extinguished! The Light of God (John 8:12, 9:5) exists in this world, and in Its presence, no darkness may come. When God creates us, we are given a beautiful innate connection with His Light; however, separation from His Light and the entrance of darkness take place in a dramatic fall from grace as a result of our sins. Although we at times sever ourselves from the Light, and darkness enters into our own personal experience – the Light of God remains intact, as the evil one has no power over Him. The only effect that darkness can inflict is upon us, when we choose to separate ourselves from the Light.

We must rejoice because there is more good news... The Light of God, which is unending, is always available to us – regardless of the depth that we have been engulfed in the abyss of darkness. God loves us all and waits for us to actively seek Him in our lives, so that He may dispel every darkness that tries to inflict our souls.

In the physical darkness of Holy Saturday evening, experience the words of the Church when with a single flame the priest exclaims, *"Come, receive the light from the unwaning light, and glorify Christ, Who has risen from the dead."*

Know that the Light of God is ever-present and extended to you, and through His Light we may truly experience life! Do not hesitate, if you have been away from the Church and are un-

familiar with the experience and love of God – Come!

Come! Receive the Light that will heal any darkness in your life!

Come! Experience the Love of God that makes all things whole!

Come! Glorify Christ, Who has risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and to those in the tomb, He has bestowed life!

Truly, as we will proclaim early Sunday morning...

Christ is Risen!

Orthodox Christian Stewardship is a way of life, which acknowledges accountability, reverence and responsibility before God. A primary goal of Stewardship is to promote spiritual growth and strengthen faith. Becoming a Steward begins when we believe in God, to Whom we give our love, loyalty and trust, and act on those beliefs. As Stewards, we affirm that every aspect of our lives comes as a gift from Him. Stewardship calls on the faithful to cheerfully offer back to God a portion of the gifts with which they have been blessed.

An Orthodox Christian Steward is an active participant in the life of the Church. The parish encourages all who accept the Orthodox Faith to become practicing Stewards. Each year the Steward is expected to carefully review his or her personal circumstances and make a commitment of time, talent, and treasure to support the Parish and her Ministries, which in turn support the National Ministries of our Archdiocese, Metropolises, and institutions.

Effective Stewardship Ministry is not a single event or project. Rather, it is going out to our people wherever they are in their walk with Christ, listening to their concerns, helping them to realize their importance as branches of the True Vine and encouraging them to offer their gifts in His service. We use various resources to support our efforts, but unless we meet with our people personally, sincerely listen to their ideas and concerns, and share a vision for the future of the parish, our efforts will not reach their full potential.

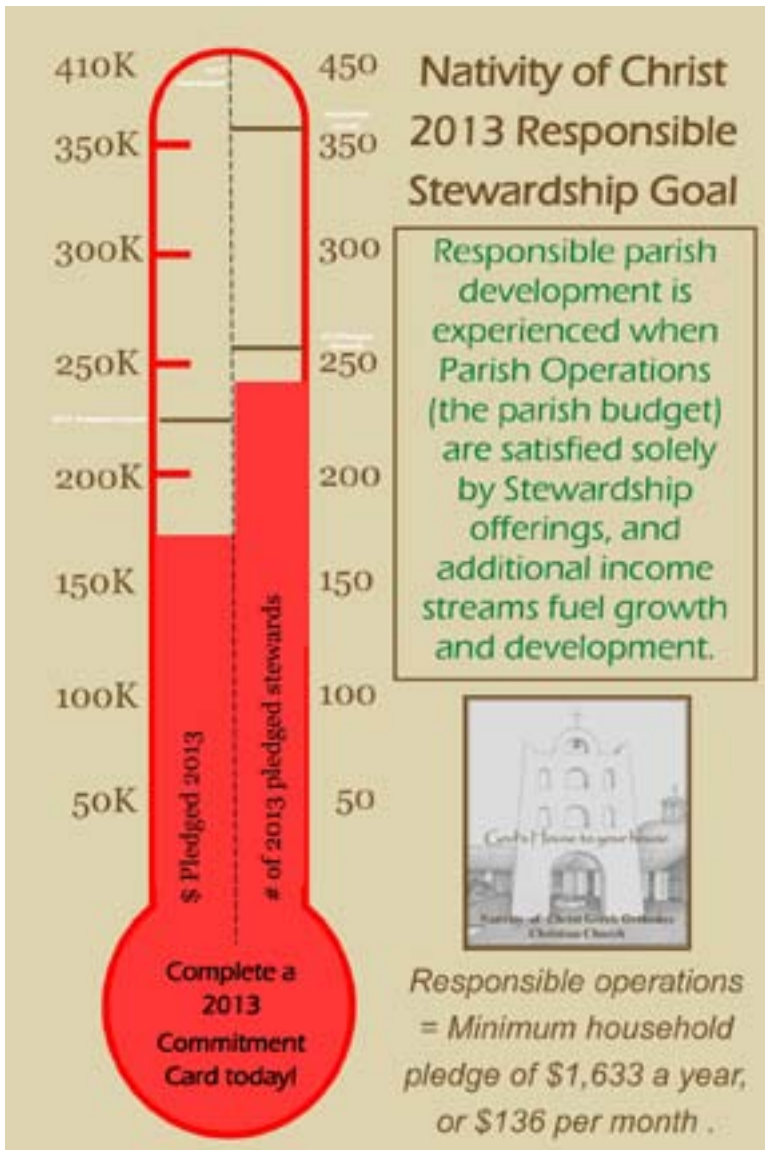

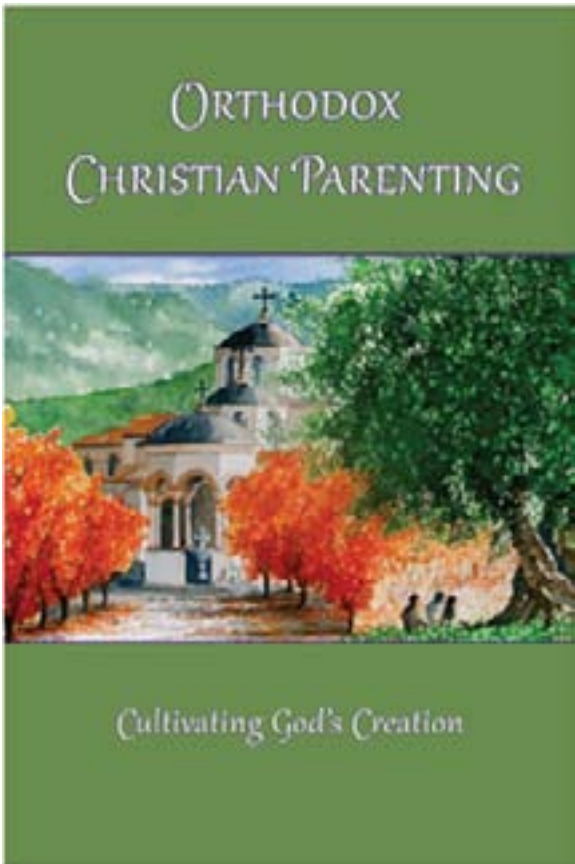

HOLY WEEK

Throughout the year we eagerly anticipate the experience of Holy Week, as it so appropriately shepherds us to the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection. Intellectually, emotionally, physically, and spiritually, Holy Week delivers us to Pascha in beautiful form when we choose to experience these days to the best of our ability. The following are two announcements with regard to Nativity's journey of Holy Week this year:

1) **Holy Friday Retreat** – we look forward to continuing the beautiful experience of our youth retreat on Holy Friday, which will take place between the services of the Royal Hours and the Taking Down from the Cross. In addition, **this year we will add the experience of adult retreat to Holy Friday**. During the same hours, Father Luke will lead adults in discussion and reflection on the substance of this most solemn and holy day. Lunch will be provided.

2) **Holy Wednesday** – We will experience the 4th Bridegroom Service, Holy Wednesday Evening. As we celebrate the Bridegroom services Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday evenings during Holy Week, we will also celebrate Wednesday evening in preparation of honoring and celebrating the Last Supper of our Lord, in the Divine Liturgy the following morning. **We will still celebrate the Sacrament of Holy Unction**. Unction Service will take place at 3:00 pm, and all families are encouraged to bring their children directly from school, so that as a family you may be anointed with the Holy Unction, and receive Sacramental healing. For those who will not be able to attend the 3:00 pm Holy Unction Service, in the context of the evening Bridegroom Service, the faithful will have the opportunity to be anointed. Therefore, on Holy Wednesday, the following schedule of service will apply:

9:30 am	The Liturgy of the Pre-sanctified Gifts
3:00 pm	The Sacrament of Holy Unction
7:00 pm	Bridegroom Service (with anointing of Holy Unction)
