After our Marin Greek Festival, 10 individuals signed up for a f o u r - w e e k d i s c u s s i o n series about the faith where


inquirers continued their journey to Orthodoxy.



Through the generosity of our stewards and donors, roughly \$23,000 has been spent in 2023 for city fees,



civil, geotechnical, traffic, and structural engineers. This of course does not include the estimated \$???? in architectural fees that have been graciously donated by Christ and Pat Kamages.

With all of these expenditures, we still have a remaining \$75,000 allocated for our Narthex Project with stewards who continue to give of their treasure to insure the completion of this project. By the summer of 2024, we hope to have received approval from the Novato City Council so we can properly prepare plans to submit for building permits.

Expand and Support Existing Ministry: Ministries Director

In October of 2023, Eleni Kelley was hired as our new Ministries Director on a parttime bases. She has brought tremendous energy and structure to new ministries with weekly gatherings for families, women, men, and our youth. Through this

Increase and Expand Financial Resources: Nativity of Christ Preschool



A n o t h e r responsibility o f t h e Ministries Director has b e e n t o initiate the opening of a Nativity of

Christ Preschool. We are currently in the process of becoming a licensed child after-care program and hope to open our Preschool in the Fall of 2024. Through the donations to the Beyond 50 Plan, roughly \$16,000 has been released from Beyond 50 restricted general funds to prepare our classrooms with the furniture and materials needed for our preschoolers.

Increase Service to Poor and Needy: Sack Meals

For four years Nativity has been making sack meals for St. Vincent De Paul on a monthly basis. 1,200 sack meals were made in 2023 alone, making our grand total nearly 6,000 sack meals over the past 4 years! We're grateful to our donors who have provided the \$8,000 needed to make these meals. We thank Elaine Chyrklund and Mary Kay Stratigos for spearheading this effort and Cheryl Messner for her previous leadership. Improve and Enhance Existing Facilities: Accessibility

As the Beyond 50 Plan begun in 2019, our Parish strived to accomplish many objectives to improve and enhance our Nativity of Christ community as a whole. One of the ways we envisioned making our Parish strong and vibrant is through a preschool. With the hiring of Eleni Kelly as our Ministries Director and the knowledge of Daphne Cummings and Fran Corcoran, much progress has been made to making this a reality.

In the month of February, we anticipate receiving approval to become an officially licensed child care center. Upon this approval, we will immediately begin to engage our



community about the Nativity of Christ Preschool through a new w e b s i t e , postcards, social media, flyers, and large signage in public areas.

On Sunday, February 25, prior to our Parish Assembly, we hope to have our first ever tour of the Nativity of Christ Preschool for the stewards of our community. It is our prayer that this new ministry will serve our Nativity families to further connect them with our faith and community life. The search for a qualified teacher will begin in March.

Opening a preschool is no small endeavor and continued gratitude is expressed to all those who have financially contributed to the Beyond 50 Plan. It is through these funds that roughly \$18,000 has been spent for the needed fencing, materials, furniture, licensing fees and safety upgrades.

As our Parish embarks on this exciting new

endeavor, may the Spirit Holy continue to guide and direct our paths in the direction that leads eternal us to salvation. May we always feel strengthened to start our children off on the way that should they go that they may never turn from it.

<u>Fear Not: Encouraging Christ in our Suffering</u> <u>Sarah Byrne-Martelli Lenten Presentation</u>

On Sunday, April 14, Sarah Byrne-Martelli encouraged us to encounter Christ in our suffering through three major areas:

1. ACTIVELY TURNING TOWARDS GOD IN OUR SUFFERING

"Jesus stopped and ordered the man to be brought to him. When he came near, Jesus asked him, "What do you want me to do for you?" He said, "Lord, let me receive my sight." And Jesus said to him, "Receive your sight; your faith has made you well." And immediately he received his sight and followed him, glorifying God." – Luke 18:40-43.

In our suffering, do we turn away, or towards God? Christ is constantly asking us what do we want Him to do for us and we must tell him!



2. PRAY WITH DEEEP HUMILITY

"Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. – Phil 4:6-7.

"Cast all your anxieties on him for He cares about you." – 1 Peter 5:7

We can communicate our desires, anxieties, and stresses to God through prayer. We can best understand our true prayer life by approaching Christ with humility as he is the holder and creator of all. Christ knows us better than we know ourselves and we seek Him in our hearts through our love for Him. 3. PRACTICE CARING FOR OTHERS






Beyond 50: NOC Preschool - August 2024

Flowers and an icon depicting Christ having all the children were gifted as a token of the community's appreciation.

Daphne Cummings began the licensing process in 2021 and worked diligently to ensure all the necessary paperwork was completed in anticipation of its submittal. Upon the hiring of Eleni Kelley as Ministries Director in 2023, she reignited the licensing process and served as the engine to propel this initiative forward. In this process, Fran Corcoran and Kathy Marshall offered invaluable knowledge and experience to complement the early stages of a program in its infancy with tremendous potential.

In June of 2024, after a thorough search of qualified candidates, the Advisory Committee unanimously recommended to the Parish Council the hiring of Angelina Susmani. Born and raised as a parishioner of Nativity of Christ, Angelina brings youthfulness and experience as she completed 12 years at the preschool at North Marin Community Services. It is no coincidence that North Marin Community Services was also our 2024 Marin Greek Festival Charity Partner! Truly another example of God working through our Parish to accomplish this worthy goal.

On Monday, August 26, we began our Nativity of Christ Preschool and pray that it continues to be a worthy endeavor for our Parish and the greater community. We are grateful to the donors of the Beyond 50 Plan where roughly \$20,000 has been allocated to startup costs: furniture, facility enhancements, materials, and other items were all possible through donations of the Beyond 50 Plan.

It is our hope that the faithful of this Parish continue to promote the NOC Preschool to the entire community by reminding them that NOC Preschool:

- Is open to ALL children from 2 - 5 years old, Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 8:30 am - 3:00 pm.

- Accepts state funding and vouchers supplements.

- Has open enrollment and will accept new students at anytime!

<u>New Cell Phone Antennas at</u> <u>Nativity of Christ</u>

On Sunday, October 20, the Parish Assembly was informed that, the coming months, in construction will begin on our campus for a fourth and final cell phone provider, Verizon. Currently there are antennas for AT&T, T-Mobile, and Dish. Given our hilltop location, the height of our buildings offers a prime location for cell phone carriers to maximize coverage for their customers. Residents, businesses, and first responders have all benefited from the improved service provided by the antennas on our campus. In return, Nativity of Christ (NOC) receives monthly rental income from each carrier.

Where will the new Verizon antennas be installed?

Each carrier's antennas are strategically placed to face east, south, and west. Verizon will install antennas on the east wall of the large hall and the west wall of the church. Additionally, the cupola on the large hall will be heightened and its architecture will be slightly altered to accommodate the new antennas facing south. Additional enclosures will be placed on the church and the large hall to accommodate the new antennas facing east and west.


Do the cell phone antennas pose any health concern?

Health and safety of our community remain our top priority. Over the years, we've been informed and assured, that the type of radiation being emitted from these antennas (radio frequency, or RF, radiation) is a type of non-ionizing electromagnetic radiation. This is similar to the radiation emitted by radio and television broadcast signals and considered not harmful to human tissue at typical exposure levels. Additionally, it is well documented that the antennas emit radiation directionally, towards the horizon, and not towards common spaces of our campus.

The Parish Council is also pursing a professional to measure radio frequencies on our campus to ensure that these measurements do not exceed federal limits. The Assembly was also reminded that a parishioner performed a thorough, researched report prior to the installation of the original antennas in the early 2000s.

Are the cell phone antennas our largest source of revenue?

No. Our Parish's primary source of income remains the stewardship of our parishioners.



Beyond 50 Goal: Develop and Increase Financial Resources

With contributions exceeding \$300,000 annually, stewardship is a greater source of revenue than both the Marin Greek Festival and the cell phone antennas combined. Nativity of Christ is blessed with its stewards who continue to support the operating budget and ministries of our Parish.

How has NOC used the revenue from the cell phone antennas?


Our community has been blessed over these past 20 years to receive this additional source of income. The revenue from these antennas has not only ensured our financial stability over the years, but also enabled us to purchase a Parish Home and retire its mortgage just six years after its purchase. A Ministries Director and generous giving towards philanthropic organizations are additional examples of how we've been able to allocate these funds.

How will the additional Verizon revenue be allocated?

This additional, anticipated revenue was not incorporated into the 2025 operating budget. The Parish Council is discussing its future purpose and will report back to the Parish Assembly in the Spring.

Securing the lease agreements of these cell phone tower contracts is complex and demands a great deal of time. NOC has greatly benefited from previous leadership securing this source of revenue but we extend our deepest gratitude to Kim Daifotis and Steve Rouman who have spent countless hours negotiating with Verizon and their representatives these last several years. May God continue to bless us as we serve His Holy Name!



What's our progress with the City of Novato for the Narthex Gateway?

October 2023 - The City of Novato informed Nativity of Christ that a more detailed submittal will be needed in the form of a Master Plan and Precise Development Plan.

November 2023 - September 2024 - CJK performed the requirements listed for the Master Plan and Precise Development Plan. Examples: Zoning/Planning Applications, traffic information, geological hazard map, site and grading plans, landscape architectural renderings, a biological cultural report, and much more.

November 2024 - Nativity awaits confirmation from the City of Novato that our Master Plan and Precise Development Plan is complete so our submission can begin its process of approval by the Planning Commission and the Novato City Council.
